Founded in 1947 by John Brooke-Little, a future Clarenceux King of Arms at Her Majesty's College of Arms, **The Heraldry Society** aims to promote and encourage the study and knowledge of and to foster and extend interest in the science of heraldry, armory, chivalry, precedence, ceremonial, genealogy, family history and all kindred subjects and disciplines.

A registered non-profit making company and an educational charity, the Society holds seasonal monthly meetings in London, hosts a regular Congress, maintains an informative website, and publishes a journal and quarterly newsletter.

The Society's membership is worldwide, inclusive and open to all. No prior knowledge of Heraldry is necessary and it is certainly not a prerequisite for members to possess their own coat of arms.

## The CORPORATE HERALDRY AWARD 2019

In alternate years the Society invites its members to nominate UK or overseas organizations whose interesting, innovative or inspiring use of their granted armorial bearings has captured a member's attention.

Such organizations can include corporate and sporting bodies, schools, colleges and universities, local authority and government departments, banks and financial institutions, etc.

The entries are considered and the most notable selected by the Council of the Society – usually assisted by a Herald from Her Majesty's College of Arms.

The bespoke handpainted Award is presented at the Society's Annual Lunch and frequently attracts the attention of the national and/or local media, creating favourable publicity for both the organization and The Heraldry Society.
